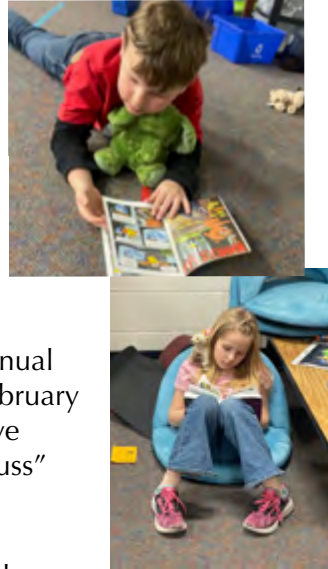

Summer Athlete Conditioning Program

Hello from all us here at the Bus Garage, we hope you're having a great start to your spring and looking forward to some fun this summer. My name is Joe Wisner and I would like to introduce myself to you all as I am your new Transportation Director. First of all, I would like to thank you all for the very warm welcome that I have received from everyone that I have met or talked with so far. I have been in the School Bus Transportation world for just over 25 years now. Before coming here, I started off as a bus driver in St. Cloud and then moved up to be their Transportation Safety Coord. and then moved over to Sartell to be their Routing Coordinator. I just recently got married and we have 3 kids all together and live in St. Cloud. I am hoping to make your students' experience on our buses as much as my kids have enjoyed theirs while they were in school. I am very much looking forward to, honored and feel very privileged, to be able to transport your students on the safest mode of transportation to and from school. Lastly, if you see one of our great drivers out and about please make sure to thank them for the awesome service they provide every day.

How to access the My Ride K-12 mobile application

1. Download **My Ride K-12** from the Google Play Store or the Apple App Store.
2. After the app installation is complete, open My Ride K-12.
3. When prompted to find your school district, search for the name of the school district your child attends. If you need assistance, please contact your school district.
4. Once you have selected your district, you will proceed to the login page. If you do not already have a registered email, click **Register**.
5. To register, enter your email address, a password, and name.
6. After registering, you will receive a confirmation email. Tap on the link in your email to confirm your registration through the My Ride K-12 website.
7. Log in, then find a student by going to My Students and choosing the + button. This will present the **Add Student** screen.
8. Enter the unique information required by your district to find your student. Repeat this step to add additional students. If you need assistance, please contact your school district.
9. Once you have linked to a student, click on that student's profile to see all relevant transportation information.
10. Press the **Share** button to share a student link with someone else.
11. Enter the email of the person you would like to share with. That person will receive a confirmation email that will automatically link them to the shared student(s). Recipients must register with My Ride K-12, if they have not already done so, to access the student information.
12. Regularly check for updates to ensure that your device is running the latest version of the app.
13. Remain logged in to the app to receive district notifications, even when the app is not actively running.



RIDE 360 IS BEING DISCONTINUED. This spring, the Ride 360 app that Royalton uses is being replaced by My Ride K-12. You can download the new app in your Google or Apple store by scanning the QR codes below.

The Ride 360 app needed to be refreshed to meet modern requirements, but provides the same powerful functionality while being able to quickly offer new features. The best part is that you can use your Ride 360 login- no need to create a new account!

HEALTH REMINDERS

As we get closer to wrapping up another school year there are a few reminders for everyone.

Medications

- A reminder to parents that their child's medications need to be picked up by the end of the day on Friday May 31, 2024. After this date all medications will be destroyed.
- Medications can be picked up Monday through Friday from 7:30am to 3:30pm.
- All doctors authorizations and permission forms expire at the end of the school year. These will need to be redone for next school year.



- The nurse does not supply any medications.
- All medications need to come in the properly labeled prescription of over-the-counter bottle. Medications CANNOT be expired.
- Students CANNOT bring their medications to and from school. Medications must be delivered and picked up by an adult.
- Forms are available on the website, at your doctor's office, or at school.
- Contact the school nurse with any questions.

Immunizations

There are several immunizations required for entry into Kindergarten, 7th, and 12th grade. Please check the school website for more information or follow this link to see if you are ready for next year: <https://www.health.state.mn.us/people/immunize/basics/imzform.pdf>

Up to date immunizations are required per Minnesota state law. If you require exemption for medical or conscientious reasons, forms must be signed and notarized.

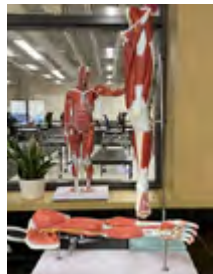
These funds were used to provide grants to support education, preschool through high school graduation! Below are a few examples of the items funded for our schools.

STEM/STEAM learning kits that provide hands-on learning and problem-solving opportunities. These kits also encourage the students to work together with their peers. These kits also provide sensory experiences and help improve fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination.



Life skills learning material that allows young students to explore different career choices. These materials are used as part of the students' regular learning and help with discussion on why jobs are important and what they provide to the community.

Social emotional learning material that will provide teachers with the tools for coaching on the spot, giving effective praise, modeling appropriate behaviors, and providing cues. These materials also make use of children's planning books and the ability to seamlessly include this learning as part of academic learning.



Anatomy Models for use in high school science classes which will provide students with the ability to create hands-on identification labs!

Many of the human muscular structures are multi-layered, making it difficult to conceptualize in two dimensions. These models are multiple pieces, allowing for muscles to be removed to see what structures are beneath.



The Care Closet to support students of families struggling with food insecurity by providing meals and snacks. The goal is to reduce hunger which will allow those students to focus on learning.

Online Registration

Registration is open on RevTrak under the Community Ed tab. Once registration is processed and the fob has been programmed, we will notify you by email that your fob is ready to be picked up. Previous members with fobs will have them activated upon receipt of registration.

**All current fobs will go inactive 1 calendar year from the time of purchase. Returning users will need to register online to renew access.

/// In-Person registration

If you do not have access to a computer, please stop by the District Office during normal business hours and we will assist you with registration. Once all items are completed and the fob is programmed, we will give you the fob.

/// CHECKING IN

During School Hours
Please note, when school is in session, from 8:00AM - 3:30PM, all members using the Fitness Center must sign in via the District Office on the south end of the building. Fobs are inactive during those school hours.

Non-School Hours

When you arrive at the Fitness Center all you need to do is swipe your fob at the Activities Entrance door.

/// FAMILY MEMBERSHIP

Members with family memberships must reside within the same household. Each family member that qualifies for the membership will need a separate key fob.

MEMBERSHIP PARAMETERS

Membership age must be 16 years old. All persons under 16 must be accompanied by a contracted adult approved member. Members are required to have a fob access-application completed and approved annually. The initial cost of a key fob is \$15. Each new key fob distributed requires a separate key fob fee. Failure to follow parameters and rules will put you at risk of losing your membership privilege. No guests are allowed.

NON-DISTRICT RESIDENTS

The Fitness Center is accessible to non-district residents at a fee of \$300 per year.

MEMBERS AGREE

To abide by all the membership rules of the facility. Because physical exercise can be strenuous and subject to risk of serious injury, the school district urges you to obtain a physical examination from a doctor before using any exercise equipment or participation in any exercise activity. You (each member or participant) agree that if you engage in any physical exercise or activity, or use any fitness center amenity on the premises or off premises at a school district sponsored event, you do so entirely at your own risk. This includes, without limitation, your use of the locker

Center Rules AND Etiquette

- Members are required to have a fob access application completed. Please see Membership Parameters.
- Adult supervision required for members under 16; members 16 and over must have a fob.
- All students enrolled at Royalton Middle/High School are able to use the fitness center free of charge during the school day as part of their physical education classes. Students may use the fitness center free of charge after school if a supervisor is available. Building administration will post a schedule on the door of the fitness center.
- No student below grade 6 may be in or use the fitness center. Children under grade 6 are not allowed to accompany other members inside the fitness center.
- Cameras are present in the fitness center. If a member's behavior violates the terms of the contract, the community ed director will contact the member to discuss behavior. Additional breaches could result in loss of membership.
- Physical education and community education classes take precedence to community members' use. Times for PE class sessions and community ed sessions will be posted on the door of the fitness center and on the school's calendar.
- Please carry in your shoes. Street shoes are NOT allowed in the fitness center.
- Proper workout and school appropriate attire is required. Shirts must be worn at all times.
- Cubbies, along entrance doors are provided for belongings.

- Valuables should not be stored on the floor or near equipment.
- No vulgar or obscene language will be tolerated.
- Water and sports drinks must be consumed from containers with a lid. No glass containers are allowed.
- Members may use personal listening devices but they may not use the sound system in the fitness center.
- Members are required to wipe down machines, weight bars, and handles after use. Cleaning agents will be provided.
- There is a 30-minute limit on all cardiovascular equipment.
- Members are required to return all free weights and dumbbells to racks when finished using.
- Do not drop weights. (Ease the weights into position on the machines preventing them from slamming)
- No gum allowed in the facility.
